



# Connie Del Conard

1944-2022

Connie Conard, age 78, passed away unexpectedly on November 30, 2022 from heart failure. She was the daughter of Glenn and Virginia Napierskie, beloved wife to Philip R. Conard and mother to Ginna Ekman (husband David) and Glenn Geddes (wife Sabrina). She was stepmother to Philip Conard III (wife Lisa), and Fawn Page (husband Tommy), and grandmother to Madison Casey (husband Jake), Hunter Robinson, and Jlynn Conard. Connie was diagnosed with stage 4 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma in 2018 and was in full remission in 2019. As a result of her Chemo she contracted congestive heart failure which ultimately took her life.

Connie Del Napierskie was born February 17, 1944 in San Diego, California. She was the first born of four children and named after her mother's two brothers. She is survived by her brother Phillip Napierskie and sister Kristie Landis, and preceded in death by her youngest brother Gary. Connie graduated from Grossmont High School in 1962.

Connie remained an active member of the East County community until her death. She worked for most of her years as an Interior Designer and started her own design firm in 1998 named CC Interiors, and kept her doors open until 2020.

Connie followed in her mother's footsteps in philanthropy and also volunteered for and supported a large number of organizations for 25 years including; The Grossmont Hospital Foundation, Grossmont Hospital Board, USS Midway Museum, East County YMCA, Friend's of Vista Hill, Angels of Asletine, Rady Children's Hospital Auxiliary, Gold Diggers, Las Hermanas, The Salvation Army, Legacy Church, A New Path, Little Tommy's Breaking and Entering and many more.

Connie found that time spent volunteering with friends was tremendously rewarding and helping others was her gift and the highlight of her life. She has received numerous awards for her service including Salvation Army's Women of Dedication 2006, Grossmont Hospital Foundation's 2013 Volunteer of Distinction Award, Grossmont Healthcare 2013 Healthcare Heroes Award, and 2015 State of California Women of the Year Award.

Connie was a gracious, loving woman who cooked meals for countless people in addition to sending cards to others for all occasions. If you knew her you were likely one of those recipients. Connie is loved and cherished by her friends and family and will be forever missed by all who were blessed to know her.
